SANTA CRUZ /— Forty-two young women competing for the Miss California title have settled into grinding, daily routines of practice and preparation at the Civic Auditorium.

The full week of activities got under way Tuesday as the contestants began getting acquainted, their hostesses and chaperones busied themselves at the Civic and at social engagements around town, and pageant director Charles Grebmeier oversaw the building of a neon-bright superstructure over the stage.

The three-day competition, which in past years has begun on Thursday, begins on Saturday and concludes Monday night. Each competition begins at 8 p.m.

Tickets for the preliminary competition Saturday and Sunday, and for the final competition Monday, are on sale daily from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Civic Auditorium box office. Monday night's competition also will be broadcast live throughout the state and parts of Arizona, Nevada and Oregon.

While the contestants will appear on television Monday, only the 10 finalists will go through the talent and swimsuit

competition.

The contestants' introduction to the sun and fun of the area came Monday afternoon when they rode the rides at the Santa Cruz Beach and Boardwalk.

Tuesday, the contestants mixed and mingled at a potluck dinner in the Civic Auditorium lobby. In an inspirational pep talk, Carolee Munger, the pageant's state director of field operations, equated the pageant with the start of the women's movement in the U.S. She noted that none of the pageant's "friends" (from the Myth California protest) had appeared yet outside the Civic.

Munger equated pageant contestants inside with protesters who've promised to appear outside, saying that both are part of the women's movement. "We are them Please see back of section

The new Miss California will then make her way to the Miss America Pageant in Atlantic City. The nationwide Miss America Pageant is the largest woman's scholarship foundation in the world, distributing annually more than \$2 million in its affiliated pageants throughout the nation.
