"Representatives of the Live str. Oak area will be invited to ap-onl pear before the commission at a future meeting," Hanna said.

He also tried to quiet fears of some residents that action by the LAFC will mean quick annexation of parts of the area.

"No matter what LAFC decides," Hanna declared, "its only action will be to approve a long-range plan of where a 'S common boundary ought to be" between the two cities.

State law requires an election thr for annexation if there are more Vie than 11 registered voters in any bat particular area, Hanna pointed was out. "And," he added, "the people will need to petition for pits annexation before the matter can get to election."
