Soph Stars Cinch Dad's Tourney For SC

Santa Cruz' three soph sensations, plus a senior, sizzled in the civic auditorium last night as the Cardinals captured the 11th annual Dad's Club Invitational basketball tournament.

A disappointing crowd of approximately 750 people watched the Santa Cruzans rally in the second half for a 58-51 win over the somewhat surprising Monterey Toreadors.

Wes Bergazzi, a 6-2 two-year veteran, now a senior, combined efforts with sophomores Gary Ghidinelli, Tom Foster and Kris Sorensen.

It would be difficult to single out any one individual for an above average performance for it was easily the best game of the season for Coach Bill Dodge's Santa Cruzans, now 5-0.

But if you do single out anyone—this honor should go to Gary Ghidinelli, a cool ball handler. Santa Cruz trailed 25-22 at halftime after leading most of the first half.

With 6:50 to play in the third period, Ghidinelli hit a jump shot to put Santa Cruz ahead and then Monterey tied the score at 26-26.

Ghidinelli sparked a Card rally at this point as he scored six consecutive points to make it 32-26. Now the Santa Cruzans had the lift and lead they needed as this took some of the pressure off. With 1:20 to play in the third period the score was 41-30.

Monterey made some brief threats, cutting the score to 43-37 early in the fourth period but Sorensen, a 6-5 soph who was short enough to make the lightweights a year ago, tipped one in to make it 45-37.

The two teams traded buckets awhile then Ghidinelli hit a jump shot and Bergazzi scored as a pusted pass fell in his hands under the

bucket. Now the Cards were ten points ahead again at 51-41. Three minutes, 15 seconds remained.

Sorensen got a beautiful left-handed tip to make it a 12-point lead and the Cards had everything wrapped up but all-tourney. Voting at half-time of the championship game, the tourney's eight coaches voted only Foster onto the squad.

Ghidinelli and Bergazzi certainly deserved this honor.

Monterey cut the margin to 56-51 but only 52 seconds remained.

Sal Cardinalli's two free throws and a pair of jump shots by Ray

Ghidinelli finished with 17 points. Bergazzi had 15 and Foster 12. Sorensen had only five but four of those crucial tipins in the late

The tall, young Cards, killed Monterey on the backboards, 37-17, with senior Frank Edwards getting 12, Foster eight and Bergazzi seven.


Bergazzi made 5-for-7 from the floor in the second half and Ghidinelli 4-for-8. Gary also made 4-for-4 and 5-for-6 in the game at the foul line. These two hot-handed youngsters paced the Cardinals to a 55.6 second half shooting percentage, most shots right under the bucket.

The Cards, who hit 38.1 per cent in the first half, finished with 47.9 on 23-for-48. Monterey hit 37.9 per cent on 22-for-58, but hit 46.2 in the first half (12-for-26). dyyete17q

Santa Cruz thus becomes the first three-time champion in the 11year classic. The Cards last won the crown when they beat Monterey in 1964.




