

The se-ceding element was named after General John Fulton Reynolds, a West Point graduate who had West Point graduate who had fought in the Mexican war and been killed at Gettysburg.

When the breach was patched up the again single organization became Wallace-Reynolds Post No. 32, Department of California & Nevada, G. A. R.
