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Mt. Hermon's New Pedestrian Bridge



Mount Hermon's new pedestrian bridge across Mt. Hermon road has had one unwanted effect since its completion two months ago: William Thornburgh, administrative assistant for Mt. Hermon, said the \$24,000 bridge and

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1000 feet of county fencing was designed to protect pedestrians by eliminating crosswalks. "But now most cars exceed the speed limit, creating a danger to autos turning into and out of the association grounds," he declared. The bridge, of redwood and

laminated fir beams, stretches 40 feet between towers and 18 feet above the road. It was designed by Ifland Brothes of Santa Cruz. The blur between the bridge supports is a small car zipping past.

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
