Faculty Talks from cancer research and nuclear energy to the folklore of Santa Cruz, American poetry, and urban growth.

Demonstrations of computers and computer games; biology and physics teaching labs; color TV projectors; library automation; language labs; fencing, aikido, and karate; organic gardening, theater, dance, and film.

Exhibits of artwork, photos by Ansel Adams and the Lick Observatory, a seismograph, and lunar rock slices from Apollo 17. Explanations of environmental, community, and marine studies programs, Summer Language Institute, career planning, Narrative Evaluation grading, and UC Extension programs.

Tours of the UCSC colleges and other campus facilities, including science labs, major buildings, and the McHenry Library.

Music from "big band" jazz to electronic; University Chamber Singers, computer music, scenes from "South Pacific," and individual student performances. Santa Cruz High School and Cabrillo College jazz bands.
