Santa Cruz County supervisors Tuesday told the county administrative officer to prepare a report on the status of property which is being donated for the library, and on a procedure for picking an architect for the project.

tween the county and the city of Santa Cruz, which operates the library system, on how the cost of the proposed branch library would be shared.

Supervisors took the action after learning from Library Board President Sara Bunnett that the library board had voted approval of a 4,600-square-foot branch in Boulder Creek.

The county has \$505,000 in its budget for construction of the li-

brary. Under an outline of the proposed project approved by the library board, the branch library would be on one acre. It would have a minimum of 40 parking spaces, could accommodate up to 20,000 books, would have 3.5 full-time staff members and would be expected to serve 4,000 people.

In pushing for action by the supervisors, Supervisor Joe Cucchiara, a building consultant, said the architect ought to be one who has expertise in designing buildings that make good use of "passive" solar heating.

He said the architect also ought to be "sensitive to the environment of the surrounding community."

County Administrator George Newell is to consult with Public Works Director Don Porath and report back to the supervisors on March 3.
