## Heavy Winds Batter SC County

March-type winds this morning gave the California countryside an unseasonable beating and drove small craft from most coastal waters.

Four power stoppages were reported in northern Santa Cruz county shortly after 11 o'clock and trees were blown across streets in two areas.

Elsewhere, a chill north wind with gusts up to 44 miles an hour toppled a huge elm onto two cars near the Capitol building in Sacramento and dust storms closed two roads in the central valley.

A Pacific Gas and Electric company spokesman reported four stoppages, including one in the northwest sector of the downtown business district.

A falling tree knocked a transformer from a pole and caused the Boulder Creek substation to short out at about
