No, it's not just another day in Santa Cruz. It's Earth Day 2011, Saturday, when live music, oodles of Earth-friendly information, organic food and wine, arts and crafts for kids and more will be centered at San Lorenzo Park.

Festivities will be at the park just across the footbridge from downtown (behind Trader Joe's) from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

"It should be a beautiful day, and it's right there along the river," she said. "It will be great."

The city had an Earth Day celebration in the 1970s, when Earth Day was born, and then there was a long hiatus until the annual celebrations returned four years ago, Atchison said.

"Every year we get more and more interest and a broader range of people interested in coming out," she said.

New this year are five free workshops at the top of They all hope people will each hour, starting at 11 a.m. The topics are composting, green building basics, earthfriendly eating, graywater in your home and composting (again).

Hallcrest Vineyards will host a wine garden overflowing with organic wine, and UC Santa Cruz students will help with arts and crafts for children in a environmentally themed craft tent. Even the lawn bowlers have joined in. and will be giving free lessons at their court in the park.

"We're really trying to make this a collaborative effort in the community," Atchison said.

As the Blue Heron Design Group's slogan on the event flier puts it, "We're all in this together."

Several schools have created green projects which will be recognized, Atchison said. And a number of electric vehicles will also be on display. Vendors will fill more than 80 booths, she said.
