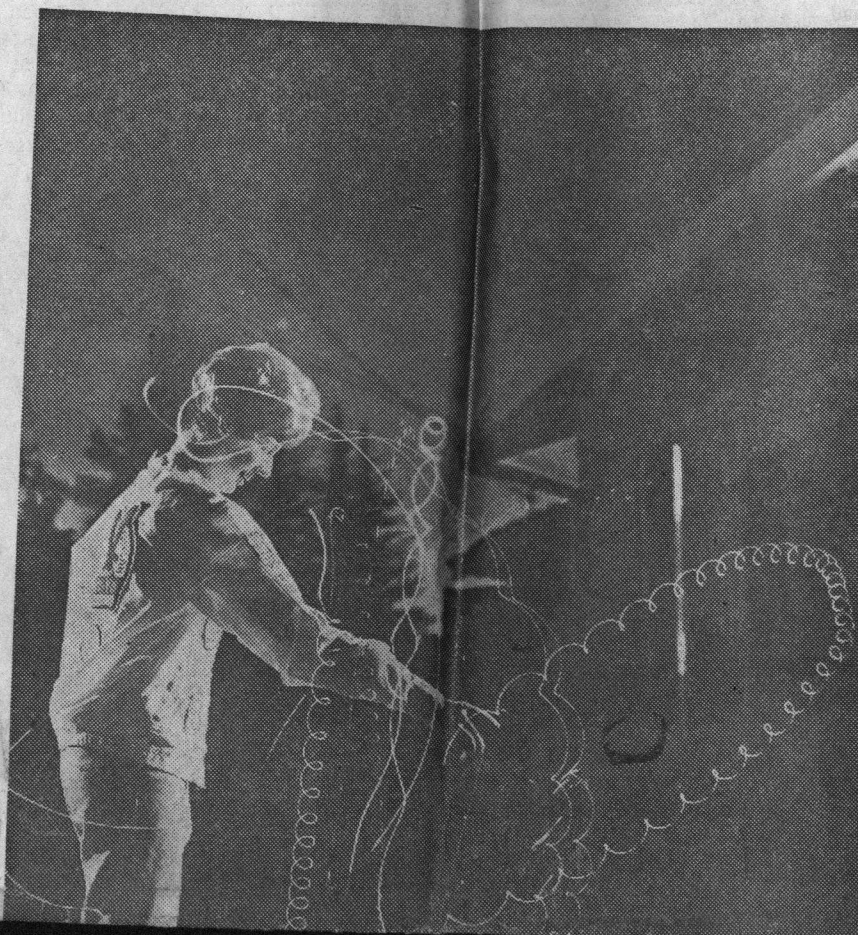
Runner-ups were Betty Nousse, Cross; and Dennis Oneto, Bay. They received trophies.

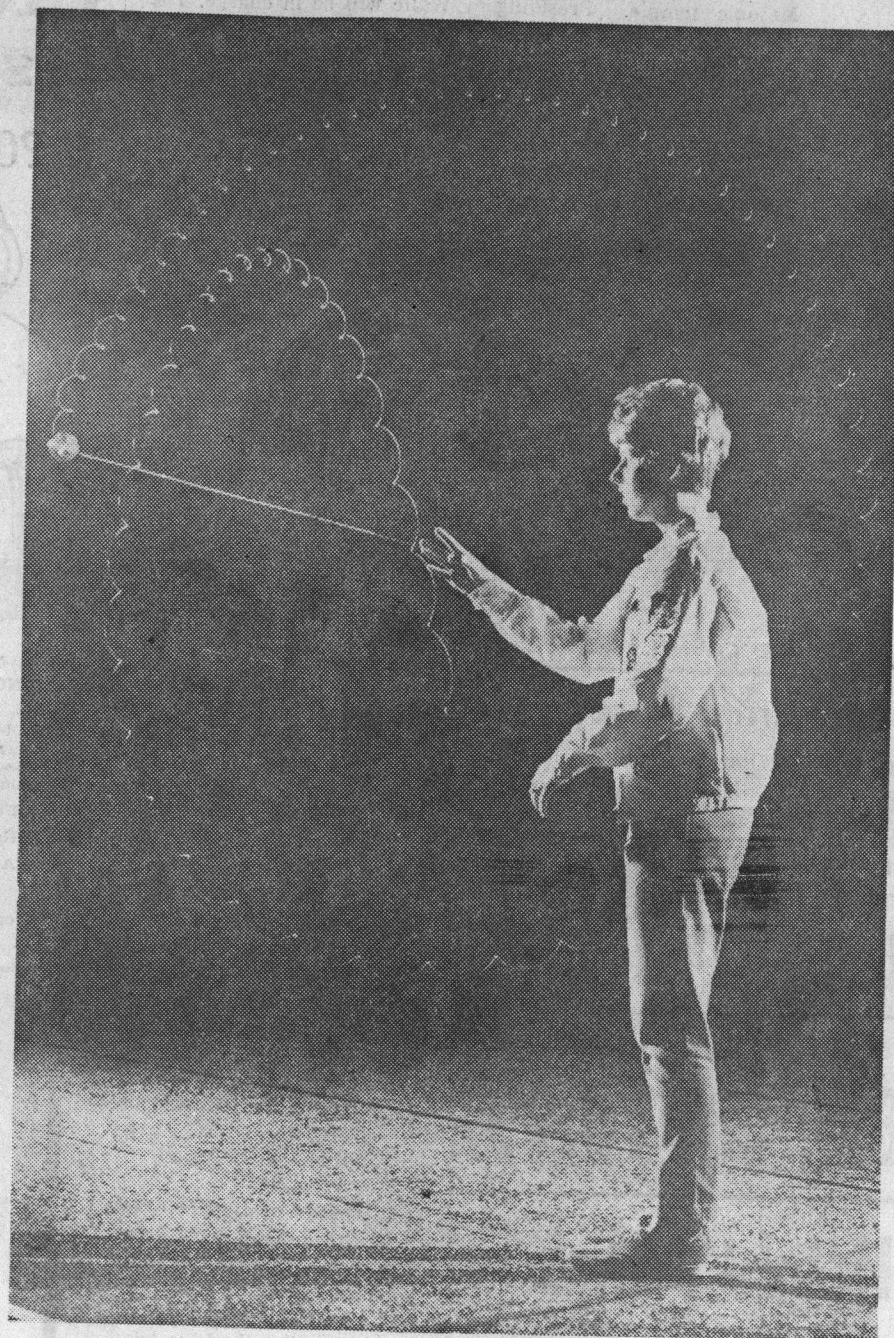
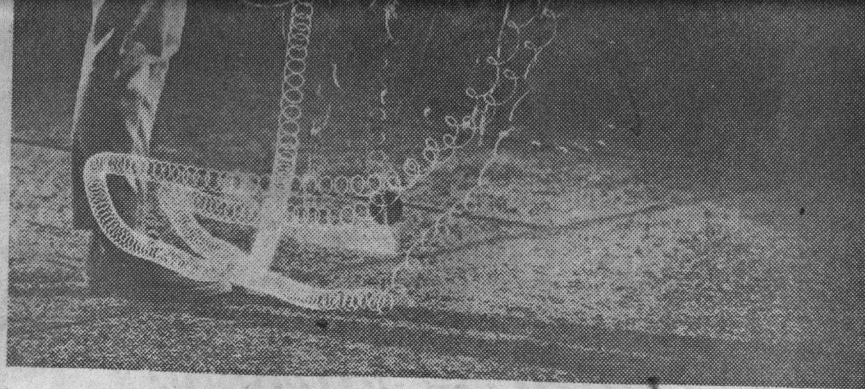
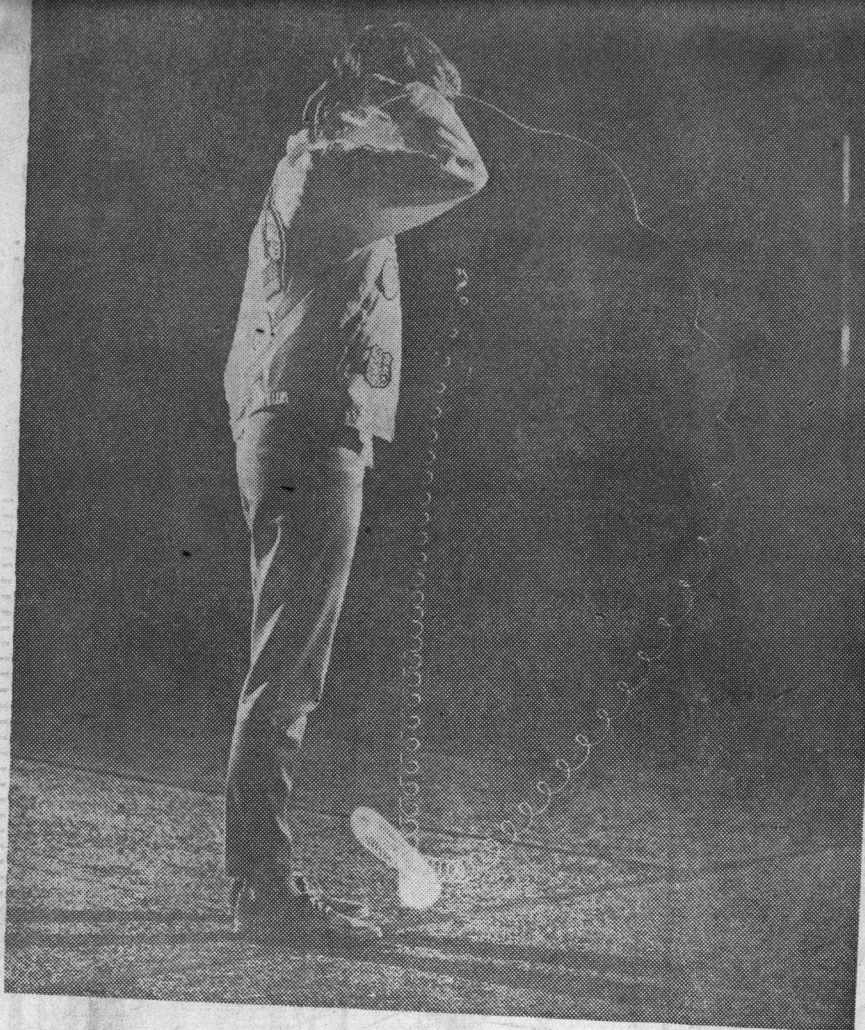
