Scott House Dedication

Scotts Valley city officials and history buffs gathered on the front porch of the Scott House for dedication ceremonies Friday during which a plaque was placed on the house stating it has attained a place on the National Register of Historic Places.

The 128-year-old house received a spot on the prestigious register because it was the home of Hiram Scott, the pioneer settler from whom Scotts Valley got its name. The house was placed on the register in 1977 through the efforts of the Scotts Valley His-

torical Society. Placement on the register makes the home eligible for grants and loans that may help the society with the costs of restoring the building located at 4603 Scotts Valley Drive. The home presently is being used for office space by the Scotts Valley Chamber of Commerce.
