

Park's name stirs interest

Only a few of the names submitted by contestants in the current Aptos Chamber of Commerce name-the-park contest. The contest, deadline for which is May 1, is being held to name the new park being developed along Aptos Creek in the Village. Prizes will be awarded for the name selected and a plaque will be erected in time for the annual July 4 parade.

Mrs. Glenn Specht told the directors that the sprinklers will be installed and grass planted and the park ready for use by July 4.
