

U.S. Boys' Club Director Visits SC

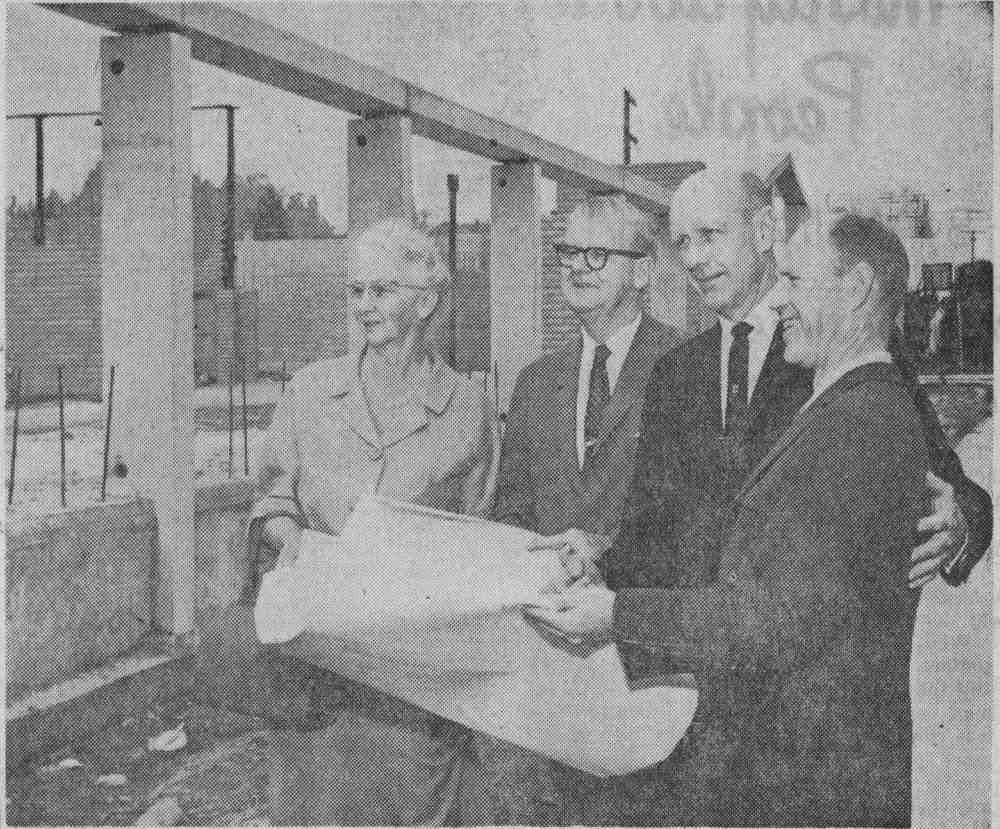
