The Porter-Sesnon property is a key element in the Chamber's effort to incorporate Aptos into a city, the directors feeling that control of its use rightly rests with Aptos. Capitola officials feel the same way about it, as do members of the Soquel Chamber of Commerce who have included it within the boundaries of a proposed city they hope to incorporate.

In the matter of the Aptos incorporation, Mrs. Specht reported that a total of 3,000 signatures will be needed on the petitions for incorporation, and that the six months the Chamber has to gather them 'is halfway through.' At a recent incorporation committee meeting Mrs Specht reported about 1,000 signatures had been gathered. An accurate count of the signatures will be made at the committee's next meeting on Thursday, 7:30 a.m. at the Cook Book restaurant in Seacliff

President Wrathall told the directors that "we are nearing the moment of truth" on incorporation; and urged the directors to get busy on the signature drive. 'It's very hard to keep up with this when we don't feel the support around us," he said
