Sylvania Electronic Systems, of Sylvania Electric Products, Inc., has received an additional \$500,000 for continued research and development of the electronic security sys-tems. The equipment was developed under a research and development contract now total-ing \$3.2 million from the Air Force's Ballistic Systems divi-sion, Norton Air Force Base, California, said Jesse R. Lien, vice president and general general manager of Sylvania Electronic Systems. Lein said the overall contract calls for produc-tion and delivery of nine already-developed security sysfor immediate use in guarding other launch control facilities, field testing of the systems, and training activities in the operation and maintenance of the systems. Design and development activity is being conducted at the western operation's Reconnaissance Systems laboratories in Moun-View. The Minuteman is tain three-stage solid-propellent ICBM with a range of more than 6000 miles. The missiles are stored in underground concrete, blast-resistant launch silos as a part of the arsenal of retaliatory weapons.
