Third College for **UC Santa Cruz**

A third residential college for the Santa *Cruz campus of the University of California was approved by a committee of the University Regents here al yesterday — although the - campus won't be officially e dedicated until today.

i-College Number Three, officials said, will cost \$3.6 million and will stress science. The first two colleges, previously approved but not yet built, will stress s-| social sciences and the hud manities.

Following the "cluster ot plan" of the new UC campus here, the college will be a group of low buildings with e i classroom space for about n 500 students. Of these, 350 if will be housed at the college with some of its faculty, and the other 150 will be commuters.

The college is being designed by Ernest J. Kump Associates of Palo Alto.

At the same meeting, the e regents received a plan for 's land surrounding the campus from the city of Santa Cruz.

The plan assures them that the city and county will carefully control development so that no undesirable or unsightly activity may spring up beside the campus.

The development of the new university facilities here

will more than double Santa Cruz' growth in the next decade, the plan forecast.

Normally, Santa Cruz might expect 12,000 to 14,000 new residents by 1975 to add to its 1963 population of 27,-000, the plan said. By 1975 the university is expected to have on the campus here a student body of 7500, a faculty and staff of 2740, and a "support" population of over 14,000 more.
