Beach Street Revival returns to Watsonville

EACH STREET Revival, the outdoor car show and festival, motors in this weekend for its third appearance in Watsonville after 12 years in Santa Cruz.

With classic cars cruisin' main street, live '50s music and even pancake breakfasts, organizers promise the three-day event, running Friday through Sunday, will be a memorable one for antique

"This is the event that got me into cars again" Scotts Valley's Vern Hart said. Hart will drive his '27 Track T Roadster down for the 10th time this weekend.

"I go to other shows, but this is the one where we hook up the motor home and head down for the weekend; make it an event.

The bulk of the festival will be at the Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds near Watsonville, where for a \$7 admission fee (\$3 for seniors, \$1 for children), you can admire vintage autos inside and out. Prizes will be awarded in a number of categories, including Outstanding Fat Fender, Best Corand Longest Distance Traveled. Part of the proceeds benefit local charities, according to organizer Rick Peterson.

'That's the nice thing about the event: we've been able to give thousands of dollars to charities over the years, and keep ourselves going," he said.

This year's Beach Street Honored Couple will be Davenport's Junior and Bonnie Olympio, who Peterson said have been involved in the event since the early days.

Despite a calm festival last year and a feeling that the Watsonville location of the event is synonymous with calm, police have vivid memories of past reveling and parade crashing, including the arrest of 233 people during Beach Street in 1989 (the last year it was actually on the beach in Santa Cruz).

Lt. Michael Aluffi of the Watsonville Police Department says 13 extra policeman — plus some reserves — will be on hand for the legendary parade segment of the event, in order to prevent *too* much partying.
