Santa Cruz County's jail inmate population climb record 221 over officials jail weekend,

reported today.

Ironically, the disclosure comes only a week before the day when Sheriff Al Noren "hopes to stop send-ing inmates to the jail at San Bruno." That facility, located south of San Francisco, has been house the overf used overflow from

nouse the overflow from Santa Cruz County's jail.

The 221 jail count includes 92 inmates housed in the new Water Street jail, 41 in custody in San Bruno and 88 in the old

Bruno and 88 in the old Front Street facility.

Al Stevens, chief deputy of the detention bureau, said this morning that the law allows only 51 inmates to be housed in that portion of the Front Street facility currently in use.

Meanwhile, Sheriff Noren said today that as of Sept. 1, he hopes to stop sending inmates to San Bruno. Noren said the cost of sending inmates away is getting prohibitive and he hopes to

save on manpower. "We have one person whose full-time job it is is transport people up to San Bruno," Stevens said. "By not transporting any more inmates up there we can put that person to work in our own jail."
