Santa Cruz took the first step Tuesday night toward copying a new San Jose law designed to protect women from harasment to

Santa Cruz has only one public portion clinic, Planned Parentabortion clinic, Planned Parent-hood on Laurel Street. Abortions also are available at the offices of Parentnumerous private physicians.

Few problems locally

In Santa Cruz, a city nationally renowned for liberal politics, explosive abortion battles are rare.

There have been only about five large protests outside Santa Cruz abortion facilities during the last five years, with few arrests, said Police Chief Jack Bassett.

"We haven't had problems like Wichita (Kan.)," Bassett said. "(Opponents of) abortion here (are) few in number. In other communities there seems to be a much wider split."
