

Supervisors Slap UC Demonstration

A county resolution asking that students and professors be censured or barred from the university system for abusing the UC Board of Regents and Governor Ronald Reagan was passed on a split 3-to-2 vote of supervisors yesterday.

Supervisors Tom Black, Robert Burton and Vincent Locatelli joined forces behind the resolution, and refused to change it despite warnings by a university official and students that it will hurt community relations.

Chairman Russ McCallie and Henry Mello were in the minority in opposing the resolution, which will go to UCSC Chancellor Dean McHenry, the president of the Board of Regents, and Governor Reagan. Both McCallie and Mello said the administration of the university is none of the county's business.

With the exception of one paragraph, the resolution prepared by Black and Burton was much milder than one proposed last week by Black.

It noted that only a small minority of UCSC students were

involved, as well as a few faculty members, and most demonstrators were outsiders.

It added, "This Board of Supervisors not only recognizes, but endorses the right of people to freely congregate and indulge in the legitimate freedoms of expression, including speech and assembly . . ."

Rather than censuring the university administration for not acting against demonstrators, the resolution praised the stand of Chancellor McHenry against such behavior and offered county cooperation "in coping with the problem in whatever manner university authorities see fit, and in maintaining the friendly relations existing between the university and the community."

But, it added, "such a situation is detrimental to the great majority of law-abiding and responsible citizens of the community . . ." and went on to ask that students who cooperated or condoned the abuse of the Regents or the governor "should be forthwith censured or dismissed from not only this university, but from the university and state college system as well, after due consideration . . ."

Warren A. Peters, director of affiliate relations for UCSC, was allowed to speak after the resolution had passed. He said no mention was made of what should be done about the outsiders involved and tried to get the board to change the critical
