## Live Oak Planning Group Establishes Rules Of Order

The Live Oak General Plan Advisory Committee (LOGPAC) Monday night concentrated on establishing some rules of order for the more than 150 people who are preparing a recommended general plan for the Live Oak area.

Co-chairman Dick Dugan reported that the group tentatively decided to use Robert's Rules of Order for the meetings that occasionally have become shouting matches among Live Oak residents and property owners who were displeased with the proposed general plan alternatives

The group, which meets eve-

ry Monday night at 7:30 at the Live Oak School, also decided to set aside the first Monday meeting of each month for individual neighborhood group meetings.

LOGPAC is divided into seven neighborhood groups, each representing a specific geographic area in Live Oak. Each neighborhood group elects seven voting members and seven voting alternates who are able to give official votes on items discussed during the meetings.

month. The group voted that this item be placed second on the agenda.

Representatives from the county planning department gave out three handouts to the groups on what a general plan is, the elements that a general plan must include and a report by the City of Santa Cruz on water availability in Live Oak.

The group decided, after discussing the water availability report, to include a provision in the general plan that the residents and property owners have more opportunity to work with unregulated agencies that provide public services.

Before the meeting, Neighborhood Seven, the Opal Cliffs area, elected four new voting members. The four new members are Bob Dettle, Tony Ziro, Frank Bolle and Francis Lane.

LOGPAC will meet Monday at 7:30 p.m. to establish final rules of order and to continue work on the general plan which will be submitted to the County Board of Supervisors for approval.
