Shortly after or about the time this paper goes to press you will receive in the mail a brochure explaining our new Extended Benefit \$6000 Ceiling Health Plan. The Insurance Committee has worked long and hard on this project. The new plan offers many new benefits for a slight addition in cost. The \$300 drug rider is an important feature. For those who may still be adding to their families, full and complete maternity coverage is provided.

The new \$6000 ceiling will guarantee that CFS physician members accept CFS payment as payment in full up to a gross family income of \$6000 per year. We are the first group in Santa Cruz County to offer this coverage.
