Aptos Sewer System Bids Are Well Below Estimate

Two of the three "apparent" low bidders on three divisions of the Aptos sanitation district sewer system came in below the engineers estimate yesterday afternoon.

The board of supervisors (district directors) will not award the contract until the complicated bids have been cleared by the department of public health and the engineer. Board Chairman the engineer. Board Chair Lewis Nelson indicated the tract may be awarded next Monday.

On the interceptor line, P and E Construction company of San Jose was low with \$152,932. The next lowest bidder was Granite Construction company of Watson-

ville with \$158,486.
Engineer Dick Stockman, of the

Engineer Dick Stockman, of the Wilsey and Ham engineering firm, handling the project, estimated a cost of \$267,750.

The other division with a bid lower than the engineer's estimate of \$100,000 is the ocean outfall sewer. R. J. Genofile company of Montrose was low with \$83,479. The next lowest bidder was Granite \$94,600

S and Q Construction company of South San Francisco was the low bidder, with \$283,757, for the sewage treatment plant and four stations. The engineer's estimate was \$262,800. Submitting the next lowest bid was North Bay Con-

struction company of Santa Rosa, with \$297,600.
