Mexican Plane Is Hijacked

Havana (AP).--A hijacker who said he had a bomb in his suitcase rigged to explode at a moment's notice forced a Mexican airliner with 18 passengers and a crew of five to fly to Havana Monday.

A dispatch from Merida, Mexico, said the pilot of the plane had radioed that "several men" with guns had waited 10 minutes after the plane took off from there, then ordered him to fly the craft to Cuba.
