Director Dick Steele of the traffic remedies point out that the Park Avenue intersection will be heavily affected by Wingspread, even with the installation of automatic traffic signals at the off-ramps as proposed as a mitigating measure by the EIR.

Allen is recommending that the county consider requiring construction of a new set of on- and offramps between Park Avenue and State Park Drive, and construction of a vehicular bridge over the freeway, connecting Cabrillo College Drive with McGregor Drive, in place of the EIR-recommendated pedestrian overpass.

Then, says Allen, the present and future traffic problems at the Park Avenue interchange would be solved.

Steele is also critical

proposed by the EIR, but also points out that "the Sheriff has indicated that his manning capabilities would not be adequate to deal with the level of activities associated with a performing arts center.

"Parenthetically, his additional manpower needs would most surely have an impact on the city of Capitola's police acitivites, though there is no discussion of that within the EIR.

"The EIR." Steele said, "does propose mitigation using on-site security patrols with additional manpower available as deemed necessary by the Sheriff's Department for summer months, concerts, and large conventions. The performing arts center would be responsible for the additional county staffing costs."
