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## Councilman John McBain

Councilman John McBain died on November 8 and the City lost a dedicated civic leader who will be sorely missed in Santa Cruz. He has served on the City Council since 1961. In 1963 he was Mayor of Santa Cruz. Prior to serving on the City Council he was on the Santa Cruz Elementary and High School boards of education, including three years as board president.

His work on the Council included liaison to the water commission, airport commission and the university committee.

Mr. McBain was a man who lived what he believed - that each citizen should do more than take a passive interest in his community and that it was a duty and an honor to serve in whatever capacity he could.

## Library Bonds Pass
