

# Jury looks into Mrs. Liddicoat's personal finances

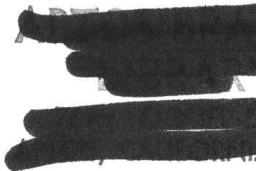

Aptos Supervisor Marilyn Liddicoat failed to report \$8,000 in income on the statement of economic interest required to be filed by supervisors, the Grand Jury has reported.

A story in the Santa Cruz Independent newspaper prompted the Grand Jury this year to look into an allegation Mrs. Liddicoat had not reported the income resulting from a sale of a piece of property in 1975.

The Grand Jury wrote to the state Fair Political Practices Commission. They found out the income should have been reported by Mrs. Liddicoat, although Frederic Hanelt, director of the enforcement division of the commission, noted: "This type of question arises so rarely, if this matter had come to the commission in the form of a complaint or an opinion request, it would have been handled by simply requesting the filer to amend the appropriate statement."

The Grand Jury has asked Mrs. Liddicoat to do just that. She said Friday she was going to amend it "today."
