

Soroptimists Present TAP Award

Margaret Lee Brandenburg has been named the 1982 winner of the Santa Cruz Soroptimist Club Training Award Program (TAP) competition.

Brandenburg, who lives in Davenport, currently is enrolled in the Cabrillo College Associate Degree Nursing program and will take the State Board of Nursing exam in June of 1983. She is the mother of two children, Rebekke, 5, and Samuel, 10.

As winner of the Santa Cruz Soroptimist TAP award, she also becomes eligible to compete for a \$1250 Regional award.

Recipient of the TAP award must display the maturity to adapt to new situations, be motivated to improve and be able to accept responsibility; preferably be head of a household or have a family financially dependent upon her; clearly indicate the specific educational training necessary for her entry or reentry into the labor market to enable her to move to a higher level skilled job; show financial need; and be entering vocational or technical training or completing an undergraduate degree.



Judges this year were Julie Armstrong, special assistant to the chancellor for affirmative action and ombudsman at UCSC; Claire Biancalana, dean of occupational education at Cabrillo College, and Wally Dale, plant manager of Thomas J. Lipton Company.

The \$600 award was presented to Brandenburg by Soroptimist club president, Major Martha Galbraith of the Salvation Army, at the club's luncheon this week at BPW Clubhouse.
