Ground broken for assisted living facility



APTOS — Ground was broken Tuesday for a new assisted-living development which will house approximately 90 senior citizens in 84 units, in an effort to provide housing for an increasing population of elderly citizens. The \$10 million project is scheduled for completion in early spring.

The development — which is being built by Aegis, a company which has four other centers under construction — will include special accommodations for Alzheimer's patients, as well as senior citizens who require less assistance. The center will include video conferencing and other amenities designed to allow residents to lead active lives.

In addition, exercise areas — with drinking fountains available every 30 feet to avoid dehydration — will allow residents to exercise in a safe, controlled environment.

Tom Becker, executive director of Aegis, said during the ground-

breaking ceremony that the project is being designed to be a part of both the neighborhood and the community.

The demand for assisted living

centers has risen in the last few years, due to an increase in the average life-expectancy in the U.S. As people live longer, the competition for housing has increased.
