

Being Junked, Etc.

Historic Bldgs.

The Ponsano bakery building, standing at the intersection of Mission and River Sts., is being "Junked" by Moor and Shoars of the East Side. The first section of this structure was erected some half century ago by Elihu Anthony, deceased, the upper floor being devoted to apartments, and it now comes down to make way for the extension of Pacific Av. and Front St., and the widening of River St., through the Anthony block.

The Davis building, standing beside the bakery named, is almost razed to the ground.

Later, but the time should be near, the burned-out shell of the Waverly Hotel should be pulled down. This inn, standing on the upper side of Mission and River Sts., being the property of the wealthy Cowell estate, is to give way to an hotel or apartment house as soon as the street opening named is consummated, the new edifice to be of reinforced concrete, an easy accomplishment for the Cowell people, who own both lime kilns and a cement plant.
