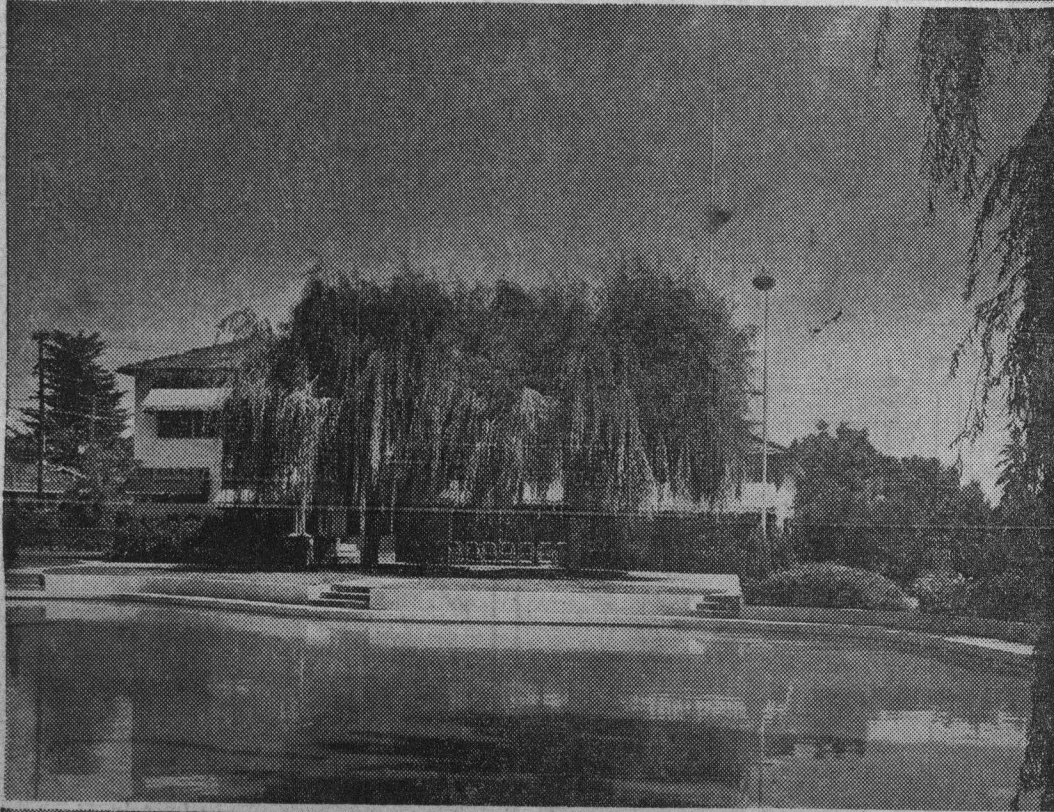
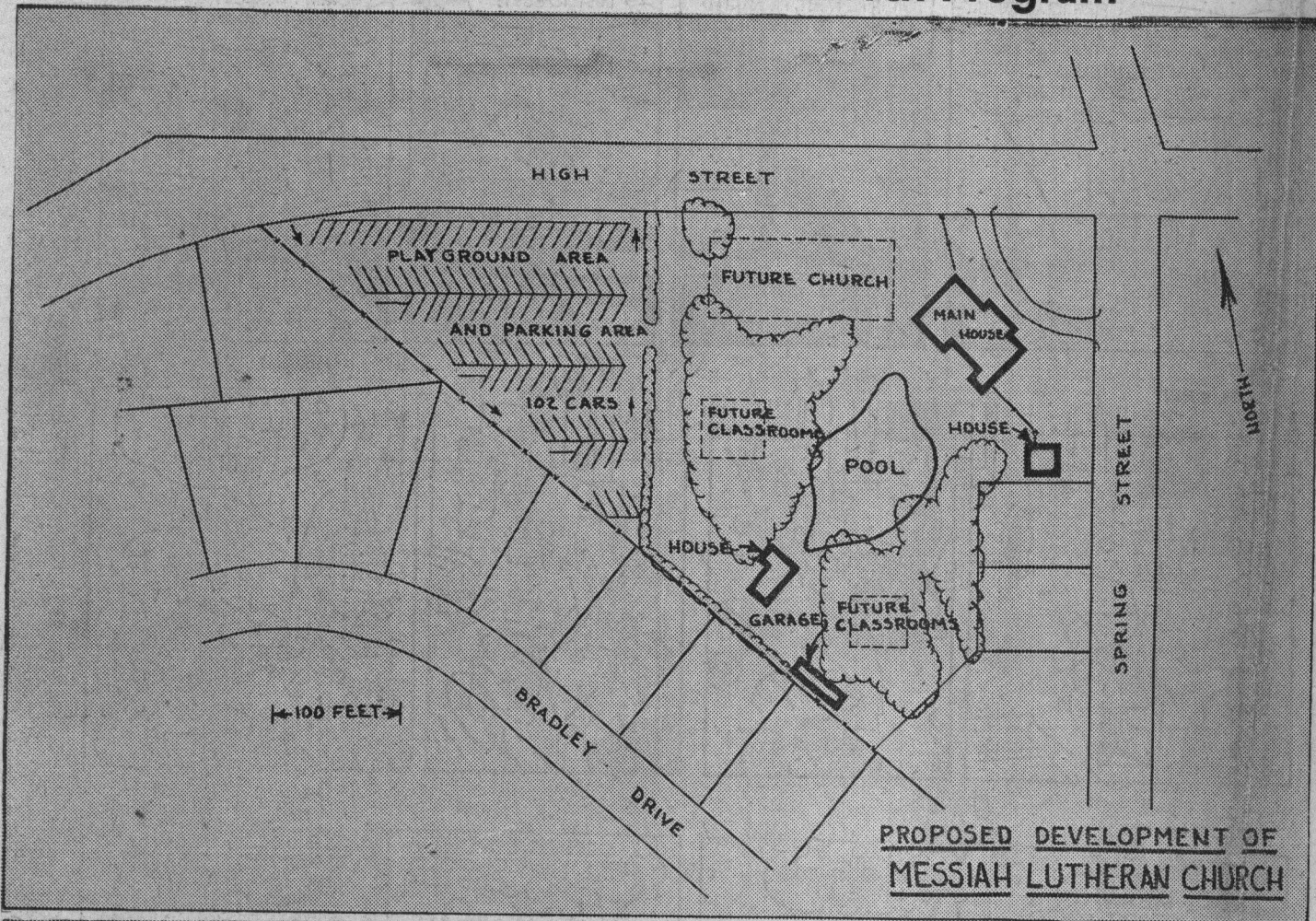


Tentative Messiah Lutheran Church Program



Tentative plans are shown above for conversion of the 3.5-acre Tom Twohig estate at 801 High street into facilities for the Messiah Lutheran church. Church, parish hall, Sunday school and parochial school facilities are envisioned, along with use of the existing lake-pool in conjunction with youth and fellowship programs. The church will pay \$125,000 for the property under financial terms considered "very favorable" to the purchaser. The middle picture shows the spring-fed lake and the back terrace of the lavish two-story residence. Rev. Herbert F. Schmidt, Messiah pastor, said this structure probably will house church offices, a parish hall, and classrooms for an adult Christian education program. Extension of the dining room onto the patio would make it possible to hold worship services until the proposed sanctuary is constructed.
