## Old-fashioned Roses, Historic Home on Tour

Original redwood floors . . . a charming old staircase, and an old fashioned garden with a Belle of Portugal rose planted in 1876. That's what is in store for Homes Tour goers August 14, sponsored by Santa Cruz YWCA.

The Farnham House, built in 1854 by a Mr. Kelly, is now the home of Mrs. George A. Work, retired Santa Cruz city and county librarian.

Most of the original house on Green Street


has been beautifully preserved by Mrs. Work, with as little change as possible. Original window panes are in the window frames. Two of them bear the diamond-carved initials "A F 1871" — standing for Alice Farnham who lived there and planted the rose tree in 1876.

The house provides the perfect setting for

Mrs. Work's rare square Emerson grand piano.
It is a fine example of the distinctive New England type home that has given Santa Cruz its picturesque flavor for so many years. Farnham House is one of four selected for the tour.
