

Map Shows Levee, Redevelopment



The map reproduced here might never have been printed had it not been for the flood of December 22-23. It shows, via dotted lines following the San Lorenzo river and Branciforte creek, the location of levees proposed by army engineers. Enclosing the area touched by the flood is a broken line—this is the section potentially eligible for renewal under federal regulations.
