Conditions may have changed however.

One reason is the 41st avenue-Capitola road commercial area near here, site of a large shopping center complex which is expected to rival downtown Santa Cruz as a trade center.

Both Santa Cruz and Capitola are seeking to annex the area, which annually is expected to produce \$250,000 in sales tax

revenue alone.

The "key" to who gets the area appears to rest with Live Oak, a residential community that lies smack in the center of the two warring cities. County Local Agency Formations Commission will decide which city should annex Live Oak and the shopping center

However, the Live Oak area cannot go to either city without the consent of Live Oak voters.

Realizing this, the Live Oak Improvement Assn. has called a meeting for Jan. 30 to discuss the matter.

Ivan Netoff, association director, said representatives of the two cities will be invited to the meeting to tell why Live Oak should join their respective city.

Both cities have filed a longrange annexation plans with the commission "claiming" the Live Oak area.

Ed Hanna, agency executive director, said the agency will consider such things as which city could best serve the area in question and what would be the "logical" division point for the city line geographically.

City of Santa Cruz would have to annex Live Oak before it would have a common boundary with the shopping center site.

Santa Cruz officials pointed out that the city can supply the area with such things as water BSU and sewage.

Capitola officials say their Male city is the logical choice for the shopping center site because of its close proximity to the city.
