

The Harbor With A Difference



Santa Cruz has a harbor with a difference, and the difference is visible in this unusual aerial photo. Eddying



through the harbor and plainly visible from the air is the final, persistent reminder of the Great Anchovy Plague. The lighter colored water in

the center of the harbor, moving with an ebbing tide, is residual anchovy oil, all that's left of the millions of fish which died in the harbor fol-

lowing a "red tide" this summer. The oil smells just like the fish did, but not quite so much so.
