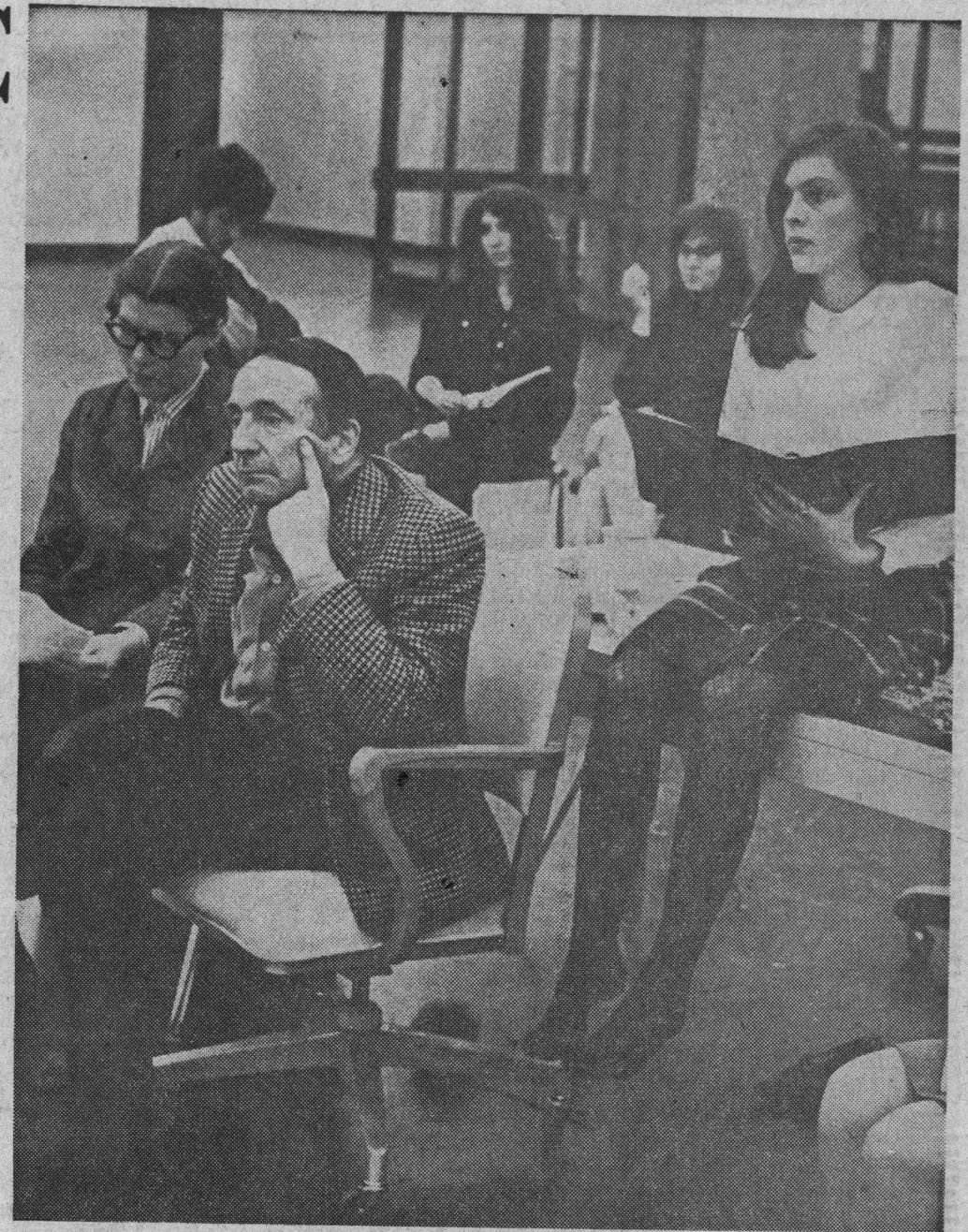
"Twelfth Night," a wonderful mixture of ribaldry and romance, is coming to life at UCSC under the expert direction of Eric Christmas.

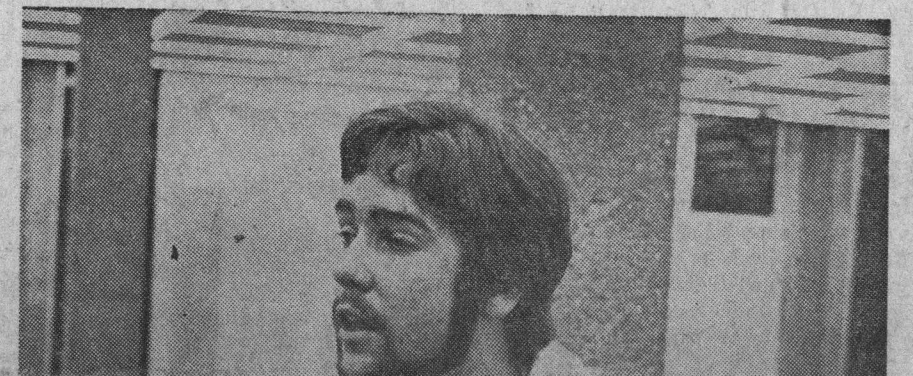
