For Patrons . .

The main library in Santa Cruz is open daily, except Sundays and holidays, from 10 a.m. until 9 p.m. Branch schedules, addresses, and telephone numbers are available upon request. Borrowers cards are necessary for use of the library. Cards are issued for two-year periods and are simply renewed upon expiration. Do not destroy the card, as a 25 cent charge must be made for replacement.

If specific needs cannot be met within the library, the services of other libraries and the State Library are available.

The music department is open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., and Tuesday evenings from 6 to 9. Sheet music, books, and records may be borrowed.

There is a collection of more than 200 magazines, with back issues of most, available for use. California and United States Government documents are in the pamphlet file, along with many other useful publications.

For those who find it difficult to return materials during the open hours, there is a night book drop.

All library patrons are reminded that books may be renewed by telephone. The number to call is 423-6210. The information needed is the date, due, the author, and the title of each book.
