Hulda McLean has studied art, formally and informally, since she was 6 years old.

"A miniature was being painted of me — and the artist gave me some informal instruction so I could paint a miniature of my doll," she recalls.

That was in London. Later at Stanford University Hulda (who is Mrs. Charles McLean) studied art formally with Pedro de Lemos. However she had started formal lessons at age 15 with other instructors.

More recently she studied with Dave McGuire of Cabrillo College Art Department.

"I find it an enjoyable hobby," she says.

Mrs. McLean particularly enjoys technical biological drawing and has done series on flowers, sea shells and insects. She originated a series of elementary school lessons on entomology which are being used in many California schools.

She served six years as supervisor of Seaside District, Santa Cruz County, was state president of League of Women Voters and is a former director of Santa Cruz Art League.
