Marigonda, 46, has been a prosecutor since 1989. He specializes in felony cases and has appeared in more than 100 jury trials. His first assignment on the bench will

be in a misdemeanor court.

attorney appointed to the judiciary this year. In June, Aptos resident Denine J. Guy, a former prosecutor in Monterey County, was tapped to succeed the deceased Judge Kathleen Akao. In February, Aptos lawyer Paul Burdick replaced Judge Art Danner, who died in January.

There will soon be another vacancy: Judge Roberts Yonts is

expected to retire.

Marigonda was mayor in 2005 and a member of the Scotts Val-

ley City Council for six years. "I think we're all sorry to see him leave him, but we're all happy for him," Scotts Valley Mayor Dene Busticht said. "He's been a great asset to the city for many years, but I think the county is much better off with him as a new Superior Court judge.

A special election to replace Marigonda on the council will be held in spring, possibly through an all-mail ballot. The City Council will decide on a date and format at its Jan. 3 meeting.

It's possible a replacement will be appointed before the election, City Clerk Tracy Ferrara said. But any appointee would still have to

stand for a vote.
