Forest History Society Receives \$55,000 Grant

A visiting scholar program will be started at UCSC with part of a \$55,000 grant received by the Forest History Society from the Laird, Norton Foundation of Seattle.

Some \$30,000 of the grant will be used to bring to UCSC a top-ranking scholar to teach and to complete work on a major publication in the field of forest and conservation history.

The rest of the grant will be used by the society to fund a forest symposium in Wisconsin next year.

The Forest History Society, headquartered in Santa Cruz, is a national nonprofit organization which concentrates its research and publishing activities on the history of the North American forests. The society also publishes the quarterly "Journal of Forest History."

The Laird, Norton Foundation was established in 1940 by a

lumber family because of its concern for forests, conservation and for education in these areas. The \$55,000 grant is the second-largest given in the foundation's history.

In other news from the Forest History Society, Acting Executive Director Harold K. Steen has been named chairman of a North American committee on forest history.

Steen will head an 18-member team from the United States and Canada that will prepare for a 1981 forestry research congress in Tokyo.
