

This year's rainfall goes ahead of 1982's

Although Pajaro Valley residents awoke to clear skies this morning, after a weekend of frequently heavy showers, they may not last. Rain is scheduled to return Wednesday, according to the National Weather Service office in Redwood City.

Rainfall accumulations now have gone ahead of last year's at most reporting rain stations here, although the Watsonville figure, recorded at the Fire Department on Second Street, is about even with last year. Aromas has had 12 inches more this year than last.

Damage to crops by the weekend storm was apparently minor. Don Driscoll, of Driscoll Strawberries, said any berries that were ripe were ruined by the rain, but he said the main

crop would not be ready for picking for another month or so and was not harmed.

A spokesman for West Coast Farms said the rain did no harm to lettuce, and should not delay harvesting, which has not yet started here.

Aptos residents were without power for about an hour this morning, starting at 11 a.m., when tree limbs fell onto a power line in the 7000 block of Soquel Drive.
