CITY WORKERS DRAW PRAISE OF U.S.C. DEAN

"Taxpayers can thank City Employee Associations for advocating a good days work for a good days pay among municipal workers," Dr. Emery E. Olson, Dean of the University of Southern California School of Business Administration said, at the conference of the California League of City Employees Assn. Inc., held at the Lafayette Hotel, Long Beach. He asserted - "The old spoils system of political patronage is gone forever, and we might just as well get down to work and make true civil service on a merit plan the success it should be." Dr. Olson said that municipal service can be "dynamic work". He urged city employees to get "fun out of their jobs" because "if you inject the dynamics of fun into your everyday job, you will get things done.
