

Supervisors approve money for juvenile hall.

Revisions to final plans for Santa Cruz county's new juvenile hall costing \$24,500 were approved by county supervisors Tuesday. The total cost of the long delayed hall will run in the neighborhood of \$774,700. It was originally to cost \$500,000.

Alterations were demanded by the state division of architecture because the hall will include a school classroom so a planned six inch thick concrete roof be constructed seven inches thick.

Economy minded supervisor Robert Burton wanted to know where the funds for the alterations were to come from. San Lorenzo Valley district supervisor Vincent Locatelli assured Burton that the funds would be in the 1967-68 budget, and reminded him that only approval of the plans was being taken up, not approval of a bid.

Still trying to hold the line on expenditures Burton voted the lone 'nay' to a proposal of the governmental efficiency committee that another \$6,000 be put into a study of government procedures. Chairman Tom Black explained to Burton that he had already approved some \$12,000 in funds for the efficiency study. Burton retorted, "I can't see spending money on outsiders when we have a perfectly competent staff already."

Johnnie Dawson, associate professor of public management at the Naval post graduate school in Monterey will head the efficiency task force, with the report due January 1.

Black told fellow supervisors he intends to include monies for the realignment of Gross road in the 67-68 budget. He convinced the board to order county counsel Henry J. Faitz to check into requirements for banning "big trucks" from the road, and lowering

the speed limit to 20 miles per hour.

Black said residents of the area have been the victims of progress when their once quiet residential road was turned into a main avenue.

Controlling the access to Beach drive was also discussed, and Black said he would contact officials in Sacramento in an attempt to change their minds concerning the road. The state division of beaches and parks had earlier turned down a proposed toll road plan for Beach dr.

The board also ordered a public hearing July 25 on creating an air pollution control district in the county.

Board members passed two resolutions ordering Black to execute a joint powers agreement between the board and the Aptos Sanitation district, of which Black is chairman. The county is lending \$80,000 to the district for soil compaction work on the latest Rio del Mar road project.
