Cowell College Bids In

Jasper Construction company of Santa Cruz was low bidder yesterday for construction of Cowell college, which will be the first college on the University of California campus.

Jasper's bid of \$3,901,930 was "quite a bit" over engineering estimates, university officials said. Only two bids were received, the other from Nomellini Construction, Stockton.

The university hopes to get the bid within an acceptable price by reducing some items, planning chief Jack Wagstaff said today. If the bid is still over estimate, approval of the board of regents will be needed, since the regents would have to authorize spending the extra money.

Cowell college is the third major campus project to be bid. The first two, the central services building and natural sciences unit I, are under construction. Cowell will serve 600 students.

The Cowell college complex will include residential quarters, classroom buildings, dining facilities and library. Living areas will be built for 400 "live-in" students and 10 to 12 faculty fellows. A house for the provost will be built, and locker and shower room facilities for the planned 200 non-resident students will be built.

The facilities for non-resident students are intended to help make the commuter student part of the over-all college life, by enabling them to remain on campus to take part in various activities.

Two to four-story residence units will be grouped around courts west of the central college buildings, with separate groupings for men and women students.

The central building will contain common facilities, including kitchen, dining room, bookstore, faculty offices, tutorial and seminar room, the Cowell memorial room, and space for the student health service.

The college's library, for reference and recreational reading, will contain approximately 15,000 volumes.

Special facilities in the college not provided by state or federal funds will be made possible from an \$800,000 gift from the S. H. Cowell foundation.

Architect for Cowell college is Wurster, Bernardi and Emmons, a San Francisco firm.

The UCSC timetable calls for enrollment of first students in fall of 1965.
