Boys and girls from kindergarten age through seventh grade will meet each day, Monday through Friday, from 9 to 11:30 a.m.

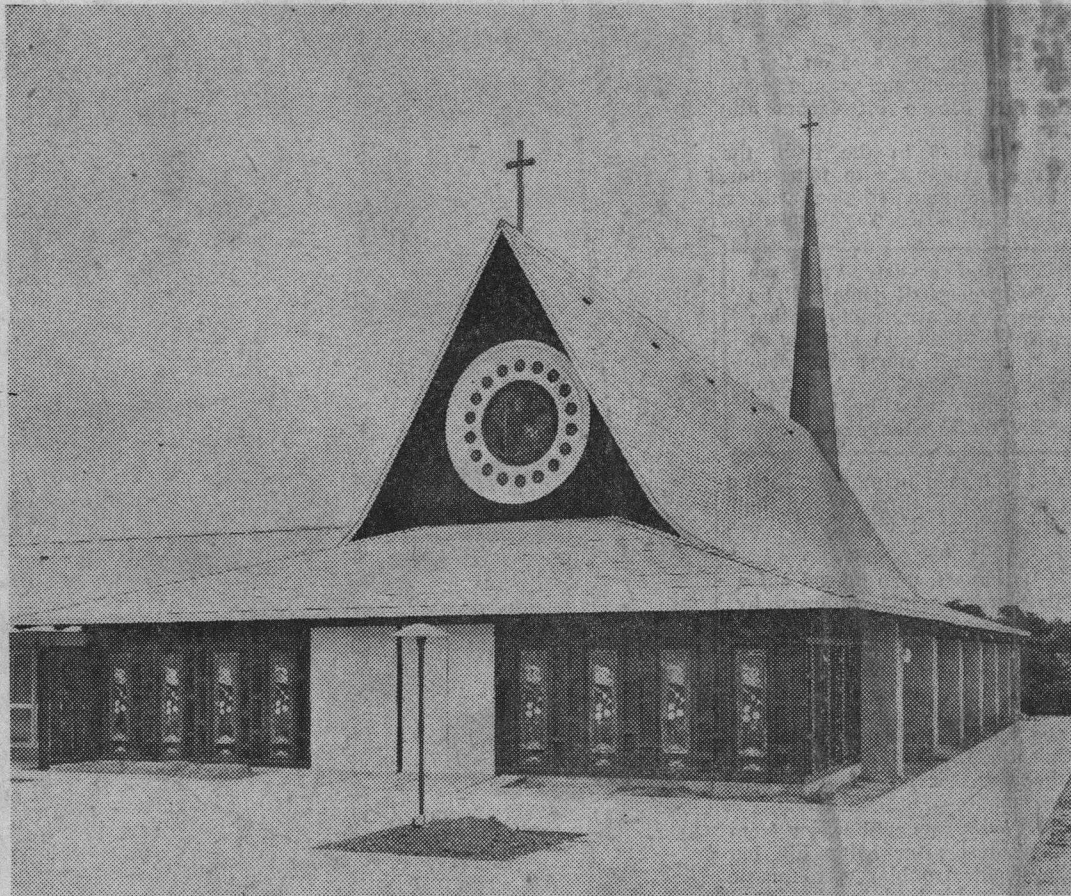
