



## Ocean Shore Highway Improved Near San Mateo County Border

These Sentinel photographs show the extent of the recentlycompleted highway project on the Ocean Shore highway from Finney creek to 1 mile north of Ano Nuevo creek just beyond the county line in San Mateo county.

Top left is looking south on the new highway, a wide, twolane modern road while top right shows the sharp right angle turn at the old bridge across Ano Nuevo (New Year) creek. The new project eliminates the narrow and dangerous bridge crossing for through traffic.

Lower left is a view of the new highway looking north while at the lower right is a picture of the old bridge at Ano Nuevo

The project was completed earlier this month by the Granite Construction company of Santa Cruz in a contract with the state division of highways and the board of directors of Joint Highway District No. 9.

causing a non-injury accident on the Watsonville freeway Friday afternoon.
