Turck has some pictures, too. All they show, though, is a chain blocking off a room from part of a tour of the house. "The tour guide was talking, and I was thinking to myself, 'If there is a ghost here, I wish he would do something to let me know he's here."

At that very moment, the chain four or five feet away began unaccountably to swing gently back an forth. "After watching it in surprise for about 30 seconds, I told the tour guide. He just nodded, and said, 'It happens all the time,' and went on with the tour."

Turck uses the term "he" but one shadow picture of the house shows what looks like the shadow of an elderly woman, one of Whaleys who presumably still haunts the place.

From his apartment at 369-J Western Drive, Turck can look at the sometimes-gloomy canyon where fog sweeps in, and just up the street is the home where two victims of killer Mullin Herbert met deaths.
