San Bruno police booked Russell D. Gideon, 22, of Daly City on a charge of attempted murder.

Before the blond divorcee was rushed to the San Mateo Community hospital, she told officers:

"It was the man who put in my phone."

Officers said she was stabbed eight times with the screwdriver Gideon used in his work.

Police said Gideon told this story:

He decided to "just drop in" on Mrs. Colvin. He drove the green company truck to her home.

"We started talking, and then I blacked out," Gideon said. The blonde woman divorced Realtor Art Colvin August 10.

# Goodwill Industries To Show Off New Repairs Center This Week

This will be a proud week for the Goodwill Industries of Santa Cruz and Monterey counties.

A new \$135,000 vocational service center, where tons of usable discarded clothing, household goods, furniture and toys will be repaired and fed to retail Goodwill stores in the Monterey bay area, went into operation this week at 350 Encinal street.

Ventilated and lighted, the new structure provides a specialized center where 98 physically handicapped persons learn jobs in a sheltered work environment. The old center was at 204 Union street.

## Electronic Listing Service In SC

"What Wall Street provides the trader of stocks we can now offer in part to the buyer of investment real estate," announced C. M. Carlson, long-established local realtor.

Carlson, whose firm is at 1626 Seabright avenue, is the sole Santa Cruz representative of Trans Terra Electronic Listing Service, which now provides a central clearinghouse for investment real estate throughout the west coast, and ultimately throughout the nation.

Each member, Carlson pointed out, has a teletype machine in his office, connected with an electronic brain, which serves a central "library."

This "library," which is located in San Diego, is comprised of a complex of electronic computers and data processing equipment that can come up with the right answers in seconds, he noted.

Carlson, who is known as "Matt," emphasized that now each Trans Terra member broker can offer to his clients instantly thousands of diversified real estate situations.

However, this service is limited to minimum listings of \$40,000 on improved property and \$20,000 on unimproved property, he concluded.

This week, the public is invited to inspect the new plant across from the Sylvania Electric Products plant.

The non-profit institution last year issued a total payroll of \$100,000. Support comes mainly from the four retail stores. These are in Santa Cruz, which will remain in the old Union street building, Watsonville, Salinas, and Seaside.

Work training for the handicapped is offered in many departments: furniture repair, furniture refinishing, office skills, commercial laundry, shoe repair, garment repair, retail sales, painting, electrical appliance repair.

The public aids the cause by donating discarded usable material in the yellow sacks or in the collection booths.

Private donations have helped—such as a steam press from the Santa Cruz Kiwanis; an automatic rag baler from the Goodwill auxiliary, and picnic tables for work breaks from Harvey West.

Those who are hired by GI receive medical evaluation, vocational counseling, on-the-job instruction, pre-paid hospital surgical insurance, and a chance to leave Goodwill for an outside job when training is completed.
