

Boulder Creek Area Residents Claim Water District Is Liable

Property Owners in the Huckleberry Woods area of Boulder Creek are trying to pressure the San Lorenzo Valley Water District to pay for the repair of a washed-out private road.

Members of the Huckleberry Woods Property Owners Improvement Association maintain faulty construction of a water main on West Road caused the washout during the January storms.

The road has since been blocked off for safety reasons by the association.

The district has applied for federal disaster relief funds for the repair, but federal officials put the blame on the Water District.

In a letter to the Water District, Ted Bullock, president of the association, asks the road to be repaired soon "to obviate an undesirable legal action."

The matter will be taken up Thursday night at the meeting of San Lorenzo Valley Water District directors at 7 p.m. in the district office in Boulder Creek.

- Continue to discuss the repair of storm damaged roads.
