\$5.6 Million Proposed For UCSC

Some \$5,630,000 for the University of California at Santa Cruz is included in the \$166-million, university-wide construction budget proposed today by Charles J. Hitch, UC president.

UCSC allocations include social sciences unit 1, \$1.74 million; College No. 6, emphasizing the physical sciences, academic and administrative space eventually to accommodate 650 undergraduates, \$427,000; working drawings for College No. 7, which will emphasize processes and implications of urbanization and will be the first to integrate graduate students, \$33,000.

Working drawings for the second unit of the University Library, \$123,000; working

drawings for additional outdoor physical education facilities, \$347,000; multi-purpose unit to include a gymnasium, class-

rooms, faculty offices, service facilities and an outdoor swimming pool, \$64,000.

The proposals were submitted

today to the Board of Regents in San Francisco.

The total budget would include \$35.3 million in federal matching funds, \$30.3 million in loan funds, and \$8 million in fee, revenue and gift funds. State funds would total \$92.6 million.

The Santa Cruz budget includes federal funds of \$800,000 for the social sciences unit and \$270,000 for College No. 6.

UCSC is now funded through the fifth college. Plans call for 20 liberal arts colleges with enrollment in each varying from 400 to 800 students. A second natural sciences building and a fine arts and communications building are under construction.
